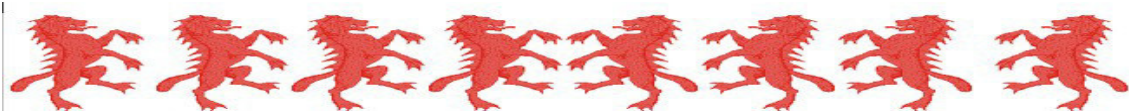
Via Harald - Practices are happening, has been attending. Galen, Martine, and Caitriona are transferring authorizations.

The Chansonnier Cangé is a 13th-century manuscript containing the music and lyrics of 351 songs by various trouvères and troubadours.

This digital version is from the National Library of France, and contains an added index.

It includes three of my favorite Crusader songs:

- Chanterai por mon courage* by Guyot de Dijon, sung by the girl left behind
- Li nouveaux temps* by le Chatelain de Couci, a love song by a departing crusader
- Ja nuns hon pris*, written by King Richard the Lionheart while he was held for ransom

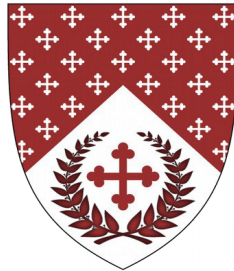

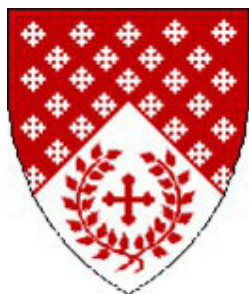
